OUR IMPACT



194 Families Served in 2019

- RBC served 194 families in 2019
- Of these families 24 enrolled and completed our 1-year Leadership & Legacy Program **This is a 33% increase in participation and 65% increase in completion.**
- 65 families requested confidant care



9 Families Safe Sleep Program

- **9 families** completed the Safe Sleep Program in partnership with Hamilton County Health Department these families received education and a free crib



124 Families Transportation

- RBC provided 124 Emergency rides to families to doctors appointments, grocery or to our office for care



What RBC Measures

- **0%** of parents reported dual pregnancies
- **0%** of parents reported dropping out of high school
- **100%** of families received mental health counseling
- **100%** reported improved behaviors
- **5 fathers enrolled in program**
- **3 parents** became employed above minimum wage

OUR COMMUNITY

Top (Left to Right)

Nautica P. (18) came to RBC as a referral from Juvenile & Family Court. She had recently aged out of foster care and was working to gain custody of her baby. RBC provided 1:1 interview skills, helped her to update her resume, and introduced her to a partner agency, Country Meat Co., who hired her part-time. The partnership offers her mentoring and a flexible schedule. She now has custody of her baby and just celebrated her one-year anniversary with the company. She is being paid \$10 per hour.

Nadia B. (19) found RBC through the diversion program. After completing her volunteer hours, she became pregnant. At the time she was both job and house-hopping. RBC provided 1:1 resume support, provided a reference for her apartment and supported her with getting baby items. RBC also hosted her baby shower. Nadia gave birth to a healthy baby boy and is working.

Samaria (3) is a beautiful little girl whose mother found RBC through online marketing for our Halloween event "Hallow & Chill." Samaria's mom was struggling with being a parent, school and managing a new relationship. She began to come to weekly Seeds to Inspire sessions. Her relationship with her baby is better, she is learning parenting skills, and is gainfully employed. Recently she reported a \$25 pay increase.

RBC HOSTED OUR 1ST CHRISTMAS – Each family received diapers, wipes, a gift card, learning toy and outfits. Parents received journals. RBC donated 25 Christmases to families including one mom who had 9 siblings.

Lamar (16) came to RBC with his girlfriend. He was hoping to learn to be a better dad to his daughter. He attended weekly sessions and reported positive behavior changes in school and his partner.

Stefani (19) found her way to the RBC program through the Hamilton County Diversion program. RBC decided to allow her to complete her hours as a program participant. She reported learning parenting skills, becoming a better employee and learning to prioritize her life.





FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Rosemary's Babies Company (RBC) shows a consistent increase in revenue from 2016-2019. Since RBC's 2016 launch, the organization has **shown a consistent increase in revenue**, with the largest financial increase from 2017-2018. In 2019, RBC shows diverse funding: grants, individual donors, sponsors, and grants.

Based on the 2019 reported revenue 21% of all revenue are grants, 27% is funding from United Way of Greater Cincinnati, and 42% of all other contributions are direct campaigns organized by the non-profit.
